

tion stamp.



Hopefully by now, the transaction has been finalized. Now the work starts! Council would like to know what you would like to see happen with that parcel. When it comes to Building and Zoning Permits, check with the Borough staff before you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property. The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits needed.

Please remember that the Dillsburg Emergency Management Association needs to be aware of the special needs of any resident in order to assist during an emergency. Contact the Borough Office with this information.

The Borough advertises in the Dillsburg Banner and puts as much information as possible on its cable channel and website. We will also be utilizing the new telephone communication system for snow emergencies and important reminders in the months to come. If you were not contacted



via the new system in August during the test run, please contact us at 432-9969. Don't hesitate to contact me at the Borough Office with any questions or concerns. You are also welcome to stop in at the office any time and I would like to invite all Residents and Property & Business Owners to attend Borough meetings.

One last thing: If and when the snow comes, remember that you are responsible for where you park your vehicle, removing snow from your sidewalks, keeping fire hydrants cleared and where you put snow. Snow should NOT be placed on the streets, alleys, sidewalks or neighboring property.



Planning for a Pandemic Influenza

- Preparedness begins with yourself, your family and your neighbors
- Discuss with your family and neighbors how they will be cared for if they become ill, especially those with special needs
- Store a **minimum two week supply** of water, fluids with electrolytes, and nonperishable foods
- Have an extra supply of **prescription medications** on hand
- Have a supply of **nonprescription medications and other health supplies** on hand
- Get a yearly flu vaccination

PRACTICE GOOD HEALTH HABITS:

- Eat a balanced diet
- Exercise regularly
- Get sufficient rest
- Stay home if you become ill
- Teach the entire family these basic habits

PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE:

- Cover your cough and sneeze
- Wash your hands frequently
- Keep living and work areas clean
- Keep your distance-avoid crowds, limit your travel, work at home if possible
- Teach the entire family these basic habits

Borough Ordinances

Listed below are a few ordinances that will be enforced and residents should be aware of. A complete list of all Borough ordinances can be found at the Borough Office, on the Dillsburg Website and/or the Dillsburg Public Library.

Animals - Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at Timberview Veterinary Hospital, 2054 Old York Road, Dillsburg - 432-2513. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.


Snow/Ice Removal - ALL SIDEWALKS MUST BE CLEARED WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THE PRECIPITATION STOPPING. Failure to clear sidewalks WILL result in fines being issued to the property owners. Snow and Ice may NOT be deposited onto the streets and alleys in the Borough. Remember to be aware of the Snow Emergency Routes and move your vehicle from the area if a Snow Emergency is called. The streets designated as snow emergency routes within the Borough are as follows:



- Baltimore Street – All
- York Street – All
- Harrisburg Street – All
- Harrisburg Pike – All
- Chestnut Street – All

Property Nuisances - Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Curfew - The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor to remain in or upon a public place between 11 PM and 6 AM. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.



 Please help the Borough by being a good neighbor. While infractions of all the above ordinances will be enforced and punishable by fines, we ask you to follow these regulations as a courtesy to your neighbors and your community.




Don't forget to change your clocks back one hour on Saturday, November 1st before going to bed.

Remember your pets this winter.....

As we approach the winter months and the holiday seasons, please remember the safety of your pets. Here are some safety and health tips recommended by the AKC.

Safety Tips:

Please remember to be careful if playing with your pet on a frozen lake or pond. You or your pet could be injured by sharp ice edges or weak surfaces, causing injury.

Regular grooming to eliminate excess hair from the feet will prevent snow from gathering between the toes. Petroleum jelly may soften the pads and prevent cracking.

Please provide proper shelter for your pet to get out of the cold, wind, rain and snow.



Frost bite can occur on the ears, tail and feet if left outdoors too long.

Health Tips:

Antifreeze is highly poisonous. It may be on the floor of the driveway or garage. Keep opened containers out of pets' reach.



Rock Salt may irritate the foot pads. Try to use Pet Friendly alternatives to melt ice from the sidewalks.

Holly, Mistletoe and Poinsettia plants are toxic to pets and should be kept out of reach.

Turkey bones should not be fed to your dog. They can splinter and can cause choking.

Tinsel is dangerous for dogs. It may obstruct circulation and can block intestines if ingested.

Alcohol and chocolate are toxic for pets. It is suggested that grapes may also be harmful. Keep the holiday treats for yourself!

Holiday Tips:

The holidays are not the time to introduce a new pet into the home. It is best to bring the pet into the home when a normal routine can be followed.

Place wires and electrical cords out of reach of chewing and tugging.

Please support the local rescue organizations who can take good care of the pets in need of a loving home. With the rising cost of gas, heating fuel and groceries, taking care of a pet may become difficult. Please remember these rescue organizations for this support as well.



ACS Relay for Life of Dillsburg


2009 Relay For Life of Dillsburg event will be held June 19 and 20, 2009 at Bostic Stadium!

Summer Reading Clubs (adults & children)



Adults: 69 adults were registered for the Adult Summer Reading program, turning in over 200 book reviews. Adults attended 6 health-related programs to learn about reflexology, chiropractic, keeping kids safe on the internet and the spiraling problems of Lyme disease. Over 50 prizes were give out to 27 participants. Prizes were donated by Edie Dason, Alice Devers, Dillsburg Library, Ashcombe's Farm & Plants, McCurdy's Tree Farm, The Bookhouse and Gruber's Pharmacy.

Children: Dillsburg Area Public Library had a record 619 participants for the Summer Reading program this year. 1,675 children attended a wide variety of programs including a puppet show, storytelling, the Bug man, a magic show, a play and Dillsburg's own Music Man, Hal Anderson. 443 kids turned in 391,088 minutes to claim 7,374 prizes. A summer program wouldn't be possible without generous donations from local sponsors. 


Storytime at the Library!

Recycling and Trash Pick-Up

Recycling: Dillsburg Borough Residents are reminded it is **mandatory to recycle**. Recycling pick-up is included with all Penn Waste residential plans at no additional cost. Larger recycling bins are available and may be picked up at the Borough Office.



Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash pick-up day is Wednesday. Residents are reminded **not to put their trash out until the evening (6 PM) immediately prior to scheduled pick-up** and to remove any and all trash containers and/or uncollected material (unless immediate pick-up arrangements have been re-scheduled) from the curb no later than the morning immediately following the scheduled pick-up.



Quarterly customers are reminded there is a 4 bag limit. If you have more than 4 bags, additional orange bags (\$4 each) can be purchased from the Borough Office.

Please remove all appliance doors before putting bulk items out for collection by Penn Waste.

When do I need a permit???

A **building permit** is needed for new construction, remodeling, re-furbishing and repairing projects. Re-shingling, pre-built sheds, in ground and above ground swimming pools (inflatable pools included), putting in new windows and doors and concrete pads also need a building permit. The cost of

a building permit varies with each application. Please check with the Borough office to see if a building permit is required before any project is started.

A **zoning permit** is required when erecting or add-




ing to any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools, and concrete pads are examples when a zoning permit is needed. The cost of a zoning permit is \$25.00.

Most building projects will require both a building and zoning permits.

Friendly Reminders.....

Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.



Residents and motorists are reminded to re-new their awareness of children playing and riding bicycles. Please slow down and be extra careful when driving in residential areas by driving defensively and expecting that a child may appear from behind every parked car.

Please remember that it is the law - Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Offenders can and will be fined.



Parking Fines - If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. After 72 hours the fine is \$25 and will be turned over to the District Justice.





The Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society invites people of all ages with an interest in local history to become members of its organization. Meetings are held in the hall at Maple Shade Barn at the corner of Greenbrier Lane and Harrisburg Pike on the first Thursday of each month at 7:30 PM. Meetings are open to the public; the programs feature various historical presentations, followed by refreshments and fellowship with other history buffs.

For nearly 25 years, this group of dedicated volunteers has continued to build a collection concerning the history of the boroughs and townships within the Northern York County School District. Commission has several programs that assist homeowners in maintaining their homes in a safe, sanitary and healthy environment.

These programs are owner/occupant residents only. The three programs are: Home Improvement Program; Sewer Hook-up Program and Water Line Hook-up Program. The programs are **0% interest deferred loans**. A mortgage is placed against the property with no monthly pay-

ment. Payment of the mortgage becomes due and payable when the owner is no longer the **owner/occupant** of the premises, due to the sale of property, transfer of title, or owner moves from the property.

The types of repairs that are eligible for the program are such things as; roof, heating system, electrical, and plumbing. Other home repairs may be made if they are a health or safety issue. For example, sidewalk repairs may be allowed when the municipality is requiring either new sidewalks or

the homeowner is cited due to their sidewalk being unsafe. Remodeling or cosmetic work isn't eligible.

DEMA UPDATES

The Dillsburg Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) meets on a monthly basis (2nd Thursday) at the Dillsburg Borough Office. In general, we engage in planning for a wide variety of natural and man-made disasters. The goal is to provide for the protection of persons and property in Dillsburg Borough. Specifically, we are tasked with updating the Borough's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) and providing coordination and cooperation with County, State and Federal emergency management agencies (YCOEM, PEMA, and FEMA).

DEMA's focus for the remainder of this year remains on Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training and Pandemic Planning. On Saturday, July 19, 2008, fourteen local citizens graduated from CERT training and received their certificates from Jeff Joy, York County Office of Emergency Management (OEM). Two new CERT members were added to the Dillsburg CERT team-**Bruce**

Hamm and Terri Hildebrand.

Their names were added to the almost eight hundred CERT trainees in York County.

The CERT training was organized by **Linda Spahr**, Penn State University Extension Educator and was held at Hope Grace Brethren in Christ Church. Linda taught the Animals in Disaster training module, and emphasized that disasters create unique situations involving our pets, farm livestock and wildlife. Our own **Tony Baker** of Citizen's Hose #64 taught the Disaster Fire Suppression module.

DEMA members attended the Annual Pandemic Influenza Summit in

York. This annual summit is hosted by York County OEM and provides information and training on planning, responding and recovering from a pandemic. Working with members of the Northern York Emergency Task Force (NYETF), DEMA is crafting a Pandemic Plan specific to the needs of our community at large.

Other activities:

- DEMA submitted an updated EOP to the Borough Council in August.
- DEMA participated in a community emergency training drill on September 27
- DEMA is cooperating with Dillsburg EMS during Farmer's Fair
- DEMA participates in the NYETF planning for the community at large
- DEMA participates in the Northern York School District Safe School Committee


