Don't Forget to Vote! The Municipal election is November 8, 2011

This year we will be voting for the following offices: County Commissioners, County Treasurer, County Sheriff, Clerk of Courts, Register of Wills, Prothonotary, two York County Judges, one State Superior Court Judge, one State Commonwealth Court Judge, District Magistrate, School Board members, three members of Borough Council and Borough Tax Collector. As you can see it will be a large ballot. The last day to register to vote before the Municipal Election is October 11th. Forms to do this are available at the Borough Office, 151 S. Baltimore St. during regular business hours and also at the Dillsburg Area Public Library, 17 S. Baltimore St. during regular business hours.

The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot is November 1st. Again these are available at the Borough Office or at the Dillsburg Area Public Library. The last day the voted civilian absentee ballots must be received by the York County Board of Elections is November 4th at 5:00pm.

The polls are open on November 8th from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm and are located at the Dillsburg Senior Center, 1 North Second Street, for Dillsburg Borough Residents.


All proceeds will benefit the library's program and operational expenses.

The Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society is looking forward to a busy fall.

Despite a year of record rains, construction on the 1800 log barn is continuing at Dill's Tavern and Plantation. The barn was removed from the corner of Bethel Church and South Mountain roads in Franklin Township to be relocated at our site.

Dillsburg Lions Club

This year the Dillsburg Lions Club is celebrating its 80th year of service to Dillsburg Borough and the greater Dillsburg community. The club was chartered on November 7, 1931 with 21 charter members. We will mark our 80th Anniversary with a special meeting, dinner and celebration on November 14th at Allenberry Resort Inn.

Through our work at fund raising activities, we are able to provide financial support to many deserving groups and assistance for people in need to obtain eye exams and eyeglasses. The Dillsburg Lions are a part of Lions Clubs International, the largest service organization worldwide. Providing assistance for eyesight related problems, diseases and reversing disease related loss of sight has been a primary focus of Lions Clubs since 1925. Locally, we provide financial help to organizations such as New Hope Ministries, Dillsburg Public Library and Dillsburg Farmers' Fair. We also provide support to Beacon Lodge near Mt. Union, PA a summer camp for the blind, people with special needs and people with disabilities. Annually we provide six significant financial awards and scholarships to Northern High School Seniors. We sponsor Boy Scout Troop # 38, and we provide financial support to the Dillsburg Girl Scouts. Each year we collect approximately 1,200 eyeglasses for recycling by Lions Clubs International. Our motto is "We Serve" and we provide our service through financial support and service with our time when the need arises. Our fund raising activities include bleacher seat tickets and balloon sales during the Dillsburg Farmers' Fair, and the sporting clays fun shoot in the spring of each year. If you have purchased a bleacher seat, a balloon or participated in the sporting clays shoot, we thank you for helping us provide support and service.

No furniture, ropes, tape or barricades.....

Please be advised that in the past, many of the barricades and chairs, while placed in front of a property owner's residence, were placed within the Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way. Some created safety issues. Borough Council will be taking the proper measures this year to have the Public Works Department **remove any improperly placed furniture, ropes, tape or barricades** which prevent general public access to the sidewalk, curb and street area which is within the Dillsburg Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way which are placed **before streets are closed on Friday, October 14th.**



Borough Council certainly doesn't wish to discourage those persons living along the parade routes from obtaining the best seating in front of their residence, but obstructions placed solely to prevent others from utilizing the public right-of-way will not be tolerated. As such, we look forward to a better situation during the 2011 Farmers' Fair with the cooperation of Dillsburg Borough residents living along the parade routes.

Friendly and Safety reminders



Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.

If your home, apartment or business is off of any Borough alley, please place the address number on the back of your home, apartment or business. The number should be at least four inches in height and visible from the alley. This would help the emergency personnel to be able to see the number more clearly from the alley and be able to locate your home, apartment or business more efficiently to meet any emergency needs that may occur.

1. Remove caps/lids.
2. Rinse thoroughly.
3. Okay to leave on labels & neck rings.

UNACCEPTABLE

- Needles
- Plastic tubs, cups & trays
- Broken glass
- Windows, mirrors, ceramics
- Drinking glass
- Aluminum foil
- Scrap metal
- Tupperware or disposable plastic containers
- Plastic tableware, (knives, forks, spoons, etc)
- Plastic grocery bags
- Light bulbs
- All solvent, oil & chemical containers

Paper, Paperboard & Cardboard

Recycle These Items:


- Cardboard boxes & Pizza boxes
- Food boxes (i.e. cereal & jello boxes)
- Empty Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- Paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue boxes)
- Office Paper (any color)
- Shredded paper (in clear plastic bags please)
- Newspaper & inserts
- Magazines, catalogs & brochures
- Junk Mail & envelopes
- Paper bags
- Phone books & soft cover books

Prepare:

1. Remove all packaging (Styrofoam, peanuts, plastic, bubble wrap, plastic liners, etc).
2. Flatten ALL boxes.
3. Bundle cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin.
4. Cover loose paper with heavier containers to prevent it from blowing away.
5. Check weather forecast: If the forecast calls for high winds or rain, keep your recycling inside until the following week if possible.

UNACCEPTABLE:

- Plastic bags
- Food spoiled material
- Paperboard Juice Containers
- Used paper towels or tissues
- Soaked and/or wet papers or cardboard



Building Permits-Do I Need One?



Please contact the Borough Office staff **BEFORE** you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property (this includes any type of swimming pool). The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits required. Failure to apply for a permit could result in a fine.

Borough Ordinances

(Listed are a few ordinances that will be enforced and residents should be aware of. A complete listing can be found at the Borough office and/or the Dillsburg Borough website.)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Snow/Ice Removal: All sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of the precipitation stopping. Failure to clear sidewalks COULD result in fines being issued to the property owners. Snow and Ice may NOT be deposited onto the streets and alleys in the Borough. Remember to be aware of the Snow Emergency routes and move your vehicles from the area if a Snow emergency is called. The streets designated as snow emergency routes within the Borough are as follows: Baltimore Street, York Street, Harrisburg Street, Harrisburg Pike and Chestnut Street. All streets will be plowed curb to curb, so please remove your vehicles from the streets.



Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. Sarah M. Keilholtz. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at *Timberview Veterinary Hospital; 106 W. Cabin Hollow Road, Dillsburg - 432-2513*. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.



Curfew: The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11:00 pm and 6:00 am. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.

Prevent spreading the virus to others.....

Symptoms of the new influenza virus are similar to those of regular or seasonal flu and include sudden fever and cough with muscle aches, fatigue, and lack of appetite. Many people with this infection also have runny nose, sore throat, watery eyes and some may also have nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

Individuals with the flu are contagious to others. It is important to take the following steps to prevent spreading the virus to others:



- Stay home when you are sick to avoid spreading illness to others
- Cough or sneeze into the bend of your elbow or a tissue and properly dispose of used tissues
- Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and warm water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Stay healthy by eating a balanced diet, drinking plenty of water and getting plenty of rest and exercise
- Seek care if you have influenza-like illness.


