Making changes to your home? STOP, you might need a permit

A building permit is needed for new construction, additions, alterations, renovations and repairs. Installing new/replacement windows and doors, re-shingling roofs, re-finishing basements, pre-built sheds, pools (all types), concrete pads and patios and retaining walls also will need a permit. Most building permits fall under the PA Uniform Construction Code (UCC) which requires a review of the application and inspections of the construction. The cost of building permits vary with each application. Please call the Borough Office for building permit fees.

A zoning permit is required for erecting or adding any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools and concrete patios/pads are just a few examples when a zoning permit is required.

FAILURE TO APPLY FOR A PERMIT WILL RESULT IN A FINE!

So when in doubt, call the Borough office.

County & Borough Per Capita/Occupation & Real Estate taxes were mailed in February. Northern York County School Per Capita & Real Estate taxes were mailed in July. **If you have not received your tax notices, please call me.** Payments made after December 15th must be in cash, cashier check or money order. **Unpaid tax notices will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector or the tax claim of York County at the end of the year, incurring added cost.**

You may also check to see if your tax payment from your mortgage company was received at my office. Send a self addressed, stamped envelope & a copy of your tax bill & I will send a receipt back to you. The State Law states that tax bills be sent to the homeowners, information is sent to the mortgage companies only if they request it.

If you have any questions, feel free to give me a call. If I'm not available, please leave a brief message and your phone number and I will return your call as soon as possible. There is a drop box on the front of my house for your convenience, which may be used anytime when my office is closed. Check the insert that was mailed with the tax bills for office hours.

Dispose of Your Unwanted Medications Properly



Carroll Township Police Department has a MedReturn medication take back box in the lobby. Please bring all of your old or unused medications to the box so that we may dispose of them for you. This keeps them out of the hands of children and ensures the water supply isn't contaminated if they are flushed down the toilet. ***The items that are accepted are:*** prescriptions (solid or liquid medications), prescription patches & ointments, inhalers, over the counter medication, vitamins, samples and medications for pets. ***Not accepted items:*** Thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, personal care products in the form of non-prescription ointments, liquids or lotions, medications from business or clinics, needles (sharp), bloody or infectious waste and hazardous waste. The lobby is open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm during business hours.



No furniture, ropes, tape or barricades.....

Please be advised that in the past, many of the barricades and chairs, while placed in front of a property owner's residence, were placed within the Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way. Some created safety issues. Borough Council will be taking the proper measures this year to have the Public Works Department **remove any improperly placed furniture, ropes, tape or barricades** which prevent general public access to the sidewalk, curb and street area which is within the Dillsburg Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way which are placed **before streets are closed on Friday, October 16th**. Chairs, blankets, etc **MAY NOT** be placed on the ADA ramps at any time.

Borough Council certainly doesn't wish to discourage those persons living along the parade routes from obtaining the best seating in front of their residence, but obstructions placed solely to prevent others from utilizing the public right-of-way will not be tolerated. As such, we look forward to a better situation during the 2015 Farmers' Fair with the cooperation of Dillsburg Borough residents living along the parade routes.

FEMA

In August of 2015, Dillsburg Borough received the revised Flood Insurance Study (FIS) materials for York County, Pennsylvania (All Jurisdictions) prepared by the Department of Homeland Security's Federal; Emergency Management agency (FEMA). These materials may include revised Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) panels, a revised FIRM Index, and a revised FIS report. They are available to view at no charge in the Borough Office located at 151 South Baltimore Street during normal business hours.

Preparing Mailboxes for Winter

The Borough Public Works supervisor reminds residents living along local roads that now is the time to prepare your mailboxes for the winter months. Snow thrown from plows can easily damage mailboxes that are not prepared. Mailboxes are normally placed within the state's legal right-of-way; however, **mailbox damage is the responsibility of the property owner**. If a mailbox is placed as far from the edge of the road (in other words, the mailboxes should not overhang past the curb) and the mailbox should be placed on a sturdy support, it should be able to withstand the force of snow thrown from a plow. The Borough offers these tips to help reduce the risk of mailbox damage.

- Place a 6 to 8 inch piece of reflective tape on the mailbox to help snow plow operators see it at night.
- Remove snow from around the mailbox, but never throw it back onto the road.
 - If the mailbox is located within the right-of-way and damage was experienced in the past, homeowners may want to consider repositioning the mailbox before winter.

Friendly and Safety reminders



Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.

Citizens sign up for Smart911 and enter information they want 9-1-1- to receive in case of an emergency. Information can include family member data, photos, medical conditions, disabilities, mobility limitations, exact addresses, even pets.

Data is automatically validated against users' phone number(s) and citizens provided data is kept fresh through a patented aging process.

When a person calls 9-1-1, their data automatically displays on the 9-1-1 call taker's workstation providing additional information that helps you dispatch the best response to the right location.

Data is easily pushed to the responding Law Enforcement, Fire and EMS to help them respond more quickly and effectively.

Smart911 is an additional way for you to connect with your community. It is a tangible, citizen-facing way to showcase government, police and first responders' on-going commitment to public safety.

Your data will be stored in secure, national databases that are geo-redundant and built on Rave's public safety grade infrastructure. **This information is not available to the public.**

Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings.


Christmas Tress will be collected on January 4, 2016 and January 11, 2016



Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:

1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow way!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.
4. Check out the guidelines below to learn how to recycle successfully.

Containers



Recycle These Items:

- Plastics
- #1—#7 containers & bottles with necks smaller than their bases
- Glass
- Clear, brown, blue & green glass food & beverage containers
- Metal Cans
- Aluminum beverage cans
- Steel food & beverage cans


1. Remove caps/lids.
2. Rinse thoroughly.
3. Okay to leave on labels & neck rings.



UNACCEPTABLE:

Needles & Medical waste, Broken glass, Plastic food wrappers, Windows, mirrors, ceramics, Drinking glasses, Aluminum foil, Scrap metal, Styrofoam, Clothes hangers (metal & plastic), pool chemicals, packing peanuts, Plastic tableware, (knives, forks, spoons, etc), plastic bubble wrap, hose, Light bulbs, Christmas lights, diapers, food waste, and All solvent, oil & chemical containers

Paper, Paperboard & Cardboard



Recycle These Items:

- All sizes of Cardboard boxes
- Clean Pizza boxes
- Food boxes (cereal & gelatin boxes)
- Empty Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- Paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue boxes)
- Office Paper (any color)
- Newspaper & inserts
- Magazines, catalogs & brochures
- Junk Mail & envelopes
- Paper bags

Phone books & soft cover books
Paperboard food & drink cartons

Prepare:

1. Remove all packaging (Styrofoam, peanuts, plastic, bubble wrap, plastic liners, etc).
2. Flatten ALL boxes.
3. Bundle cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin.
4. Cover loose paper with heavier containers to prevent it from blowing away.
5. If the forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, if possible, keep your paper recyclables

until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.

UNACCEPTABLE:

Plastic bags
Food spoiled material
Paperboard Juice Containers
Used paper towels or tissues
Soaked and/or wet papers or cardboard

Trash Pick-up and Recycling

One bulk item per week that can be lifted by two men is allowed to be placed out on your regular trash day for pick-up. Appliances containing Freon must be prescheduled by calling Penn Waste at 1-866-575-8720. For safety purposes, doors to appliances must be removed. Pay-per-bay customers must attach a Penn Waste trash bag to the bulk item.

Acceptable Bulk items include: Furniture, washer/dyer, hot water tank, dish washers, mattresses, carpet (4'length rolled/tied), lawn mowers (must have a dry fuel tank and lids removed), automobile tires off the rim (1 per week). **Unacceptable Bulk items include:** Household hazardous waste, chemicals, propane tanks, yard waste, construction waste and loose piles.

Electronic Devices

As of January 24, 2013, by law Penn Waste is not allowed to collect your electronic waste.

The Covered Devices Recycling Act prohibits residents and businesses from placing their electronic waste at the curb or in their trash.

Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer & speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the Internet.

The Carroll Township municipal Building offers a free year round electronics drop-off site from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm, Monday through Friday, unless the office is closed. Please Do Not Bring: loose batteries, toner cartridges, fluorescent lamps, construction demolition, furniture, appliances, white goods, appliances containing Freon (air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators) or household hazardous waste.

Borough Ordinances

(Listed are a few ordinances that will be enforced and residents should be aware of. A complete listing can be found at the Borough office and/or the Dillsburg Borough website.)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Snow/Ice Removal: All sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of the precipitation stopping. Failure to clear sidewalks COULD result in fines being issued to the property owners. Snow and Ice may NOT be deposited onto the streets and alleys in the Borough. Remember to be aware of the Snow Emergency routes and move your vehicles from the area if a Snow emergency is called. The streets designated as snow emergency routes within the Borough are as follows: Baltimore Street, York Street, Harrisburg Street, Harrisburg Pike and Chestnut Street. **All streets will be plowed curb to curb, so please remove your vehicles from the streets.**



Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at the York County Treasurer's Office. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.



Curfew: The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11:00 pm and 6:00 am. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.
