The final coats of paint are being applied to the interior of the Dill's Tavern and the search has begun for the right pieces of furniture and smallware to bring it to life. Work on the Wood Wrights came to a screeching halt with the winter weather, but should resume shortly.

As progress on the museum room in the Maple Shade Barn moves slowly but surely toward completion, a capitol campaign to fund further renovations at the Barn has begun.

Both buildings will be open for tours on Sunday afternoons from 2:00 to 4:00 PM starting April 11th. This is a great time to hear the stories of two of the area's founding families, the Dills and the Mumpers. Docents are needed to help with the tours and other special events. Training has begun so if you like to tell stories and you have one Sunday afternoon a month available, we'd love to have you join us.

A list of classes sponsored by NYCHAPS is available on our Web site. There is something for almost everyone, including weekend long, hands-on workshops on timber



Teen Center

Did you know that Dillsburg has a beautiful new teen center? It is called The Krux (meaning crossroads) and is located at 5 Harrisburg Pike, just off the square. John Parzyszek (known as John P.) is the person most responsible for opening The Krux, but he has had a great deal of help from many other community folks. It's Christian based, but it's not affiliated with any particular denomination or congregation. The Krux is open to middle and high school students and is an exciting supervised place to meet friends and do homework. There is a snack bar along with pool tables, computers, wii, stage and great lighting and sound systems. There have been several pool tournaments between youth from the student center and folks from the Senior Center. This is a great way for teens and seniors to interact and get to know each other.

On a recent Friday evening, Tom Kibler brought his home schooled son, Dakota, 13, to The Krux to plug his guitar into the soundboard. Amanda Palleschi recently wrote an article for the Patriot News and she quoted the Carroll Township

Police Officer as saying, "It might sound silly, but they're putting a lot of love into kids who might not have that at home. These rural parents will drop their kids off at the center then come back six to eight hours later to pick them up because they didn't want to deal with them at home, and then they get into mischief."

The Krux is open from 3:00—7:00 PM Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday evenings. Friday evenings it is open until 9:00 PM. The hours could be extended if there were more volunteer help. Volunteers are scheduled for two hour shifts.

They are always looking for people to assist with time and money. The building is available for groups to hold meetings or have birthday parties or showers. Stop by and have a look for yourself. You will be pleasantly surprised.

House Numbers

According to the International Property Maintenance Code, Chapter 3, Section 304, #3 - Buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals

or alphabet numbers. Numbers shall be a minimum of four (4) inches high with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inches. The Borough will be checking and citing residents and businesses that do not comply.

National Night Out

Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program.

Officer David McCoy and Officer Justin Rogerson are certified to inspect and enforce all laws pertaining to commercial motor vehicles and its drivers. Officers McCoy and Rogerson are authorized to inspect commercial motor vehicles from all 50 states, Canada and Mexico. Officer McCoy is also trained in weights and measurements of commercial motor vehicles.

DARE

Carroll Township Police have entered a partnership with the Northern York County School District to continue with the DARE program since funding was cut by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Carroll Township Police and the North-

ern York County School District are committed to educating students the dangers of substance abuse. DARE is taught at the sixth grade level at the Northern Middle School by Officer Ronald Stiles and Officer Ben Martin.

Equipment.

Carroll Township Police have acquired additional equipment through grants to better protect its citizens. Police have purchased patrol rifles, ballistic shields and a variety of other tools to assist its officers in active shooter situations or other armed confrontations that the officers may encounter.

Buckle up PA. Click it or Ticket and Aggressive Driving Enforcement Programs.

Carroll Township Police, in an effort to make sure each motorist gets to his or her destination safely, have been involved with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and York County Center for Traffic Safety since 2005 and conduct seatbelt and aggressive driving enforcement. Officers Guarneri and Rogerson instruct Survival 101, a seatbelt safety instructional course. The course was developed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and is designed to target new high school age drivers in the use of seatbelts.

South Central Counter Terrorism Task Force

Carroll Township Police have four officers assigned to the South Central Counter Terrorism Task Force. The task force is made up of eight counties from central Pennsylvania,

which is comprised of law enforcement officers, emergency medical services, fire fighters, animal control personnel, area hospitals and specialized teams from HAZ-MAT and SWAT. The mission for SCTF is to address planning, prevention, response and recovery for events in South Central PA that exceed local capabilities.

Community Services

The Carroll Township Police Department offers a variety of services for the residents of Dillsburg Borough, such as vacation checks, child ID, Child safety seat installation, department tours and Safety presentations to organizations.

Tips for Residents of Dillsburg Borough

Carroll Township Police remind all residents to make sure that all garage doors are closed. More burglaries are occurring during daylight hours than during the nighttime hours. Police also urge vehicle owners to secure vehicle doors and to remove all valuables from inside the vehicle. Most recent thefts from vehicles are from unlocked doors.

As the weather is getting warm and most people are walking the Police want to inform drivers that Pennsylvania laws require that vehicles must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians who are in the crosswalks.

How to Dispose of Unused Medicines

- Follow any specific disposal instructions on the drug label or patient information that accompanies the medication. Do not flush prescription drugs down the toilet unless this information specially instructs you to do so.
- If no instructions are given, throw the drugs in the household trash, but first: Take them out of their original containers and mix with coffee grounds or kitty litter.
- Put them in a sealable bag, empty can or other container to prevent the medication from leaking or breaking out of the garbage bag.
- Take advantage of community drug take-back programs that allow the public to bring unused drugs to a central location for proper disposal.
- Before throwing out a medicine container, scratch off all identifying information on the prescription label.
- Do not give medications to friends.

Property Nuisances - Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.



Got Grass? Mow High!

Make your lawn easier and cheaper to maintain by mowing high - **three inches** is

the rule! The roots of your lawn grow as deep as the grass grows tall, so taller grass has deeper, healthier roots. Keep your lawn 3" or higher and never cut off more than 1/3 of the blade each time you mow. A healthy lawn tolerates hot, dry weather better - so you won't need to spend your summer watering and fertilizing.

Mow high. **Save time and money.** It's that easy.

Curfew - The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11:00 PM and 6:00 AM. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.

Please help the Borough by being a good neighbor. While infractions of all the mentioned ordinances will be enforced and punishable by fines, we ask you to follow these regulations as a courtesy to your neighbors and your community

Animals - Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners.

Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at Timberview Veterinary Hospital; 2054 Old York Road, Dillsburg - 432-2513.

It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.



Trash Pick-Up and Recycling



Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash pick-up day is Wednesday. **Exceptions are June 3rd and September 8th. Trash pick-up will be delayed one day in these cases.** All other trash pick-up dates will remain the same. Residents are reminded not to put their trash out until the **evening immediately prior** to scheduled pick-up and to remove any and all

trash containers and/or uncollected material (unless immediate pick-up arrangements have been rescheduled) from the curb no later than the morning immediately following scheduled pick-up. The fall newsletter will contain additional special pick-up dates.

Safety Reminder: Please **remove** all appliance doors before putting bulk items out for collection.

Recycling - Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is **mandatory** to recycle. Recycling pick-up is included with all Penn Waste residential plans at no additional cost. Recycling bins may be picked up at the Borough Office. Please remember to remove all lids from bottles.



Reminders about Building Permits!!!!!!

Please contact the Borough staff **before** you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property. (This includes any type of swimming pool.) The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits needed.



Dillsburg Borough adopted the International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) in 2001. Those codes deal with safety and maintenance of all properties in the Borough and will be enforced. If you have any questions about this code, please contact the Borough Office at 432-9969.

Friendly and Safety Reminders!!!

Parking Fines - If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.



Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Residents and motorists are reminded to re-new their awareness of children playing and riding bicycles. Please slow down and be extra careful when driving in residential areas by driving defensively and expecting that from behind every parked car a child may appear.

Please remember that it is the law - Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Offenders can and will be fined.

Covered entities may disclose protected health information, without the individual's authorization, to a public health authority acting as authorized by law in response to a man-made or natural emergency see 45 CFR 164.512(b), (see 45 CFR 164.512(j), (see 45 CFR 164.512(f)); 45 CFR 164.512(k)(2)); or judicial and administrative proceedings (see 45 CFR 164.512(e)).

2010 Census

To help your community receive its fair share of state and federal funding for the next ten years, please fill out the 2010 Census questionnaire that was mailed to your homes.

Q. I read recently that the 2010 census is under way. When someone claiming to be a census worker knocks on my door, how can I be sure that he or she is legitimate?

A. First, ask to see a photo ID and a badge that shows that the person represents the U.S. Census Bureau. The worker will also have a hand-held device that is used to take your information, a canvas census bag and a confidentiality notice.

Census workers will not ask for your Social Security number or for information about your bank accounts or credit cards. The Better Business Bureau advises you not to invite the worker, or anyone you don't know, into your home. To protect against identity theft, the BBB also warns you never to give out personal or financial information to anyone who shows up at your door.
