

To All Dillsburg Residents and Property & Business Owners, we made it through the winter without as much snow as last year and most of us are looking forward to spring, which should be a busy time in the Borough. The Borough now has its own street sweeper and will be cleaning streets throughout the spring, summer and fall. Brian and Barry will be out painting curbs, crosswalks and parking lines, as well as doing minor road repairs and de-weeding the curb line. Brian has the necessary certification to spray in Right-of-Ways and will be doing so over the next months, as needed. If you have any questions about exact dates this will be done or type of pesticide that will be used, contact me during normal business hours. Please watch for "No Parking" signs that will be put out when necessary. In order to avoid a fine and having your vehicle towed, please obey the signs. Please slow down, pay attention and be courteous when you see people working on or near the roadway.

We'd like to thank everyone for their efforts with the mandatory recycling. Last year the Borough received over \$6,000.00 because of you. If you have questions about recycling, please contact the Borough Office.

Have you heard about the possibility of a Dillsburg Borough Community Park? If not, I'd love to tell you about it. Stop in anytime at the Borough Office to look at some of our ideas. Your input and support would be welcomed.

Don't Forget to Vote!

Please remember to vote on May 17, 2011

This year we will be voting for the following offices: County Commissioners, County Treasurer, County Sheriff, Clerk of Courts, Register of Wills, Prothonotary, two York County Judges, one State Superior Court Judge, one State Commonwealth Court Judge; District Magistrate, School Board members, three members of Borough Council and Borough Tax Collector. As you can see it will be a large ballot. The last day to register to vote or change your party enrollment before the primary is April 18th. Forms to do this are available at the Borough Office, 151 S. Baltimore St. during regular business hours and also at the Dillsburg Area Public Library, 17 S. Baltimore St. during regular business hours.

The last day to apply for a civilian absentee ballot is May 10th. Again these are available at the Borough Office or at the Dillsburg Area Public Library. The last day the voted civilian absentee ballots must be received by the York County Board of Elections is May 13th, at 5:00pm.

The polls are open on May 17th from 7:00am to 8:00pm and are located at the Dillsburg Senior Center, 1 North Second Street, for Dillsburg Borough Residents.

Yard Sale Signs

In accordance with Chapter 69 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, entitled Public Utilities, Section 6905 Nails and other hard substances attached to utility poles.

§ 6905. Nails and other hard substances attached to utility poles.

- (a) Offense defined – A person is guilty of a summary offense if he/she drives a nail, staple or tack or attaches any metal or hard substance to or into any pole of any public utility pole line.



Therefore, no signs are allowed to be nailed, stapled or tacked to any utility poles and all signs, flyers, posters, and bulletins advertising the yard sale, must be removed by 8:00am the day after the yard sale. **Signs may be tied or taped only.**

Work, school, activities, hobbies – the schedules are hectic and free time is at a premium. We understand the time constraints these days, but the Borough still needs YOU.




The borough would like to comprise a list of those who would be willing to serve on committees, run for council, lend a hand with revitalization and community projects, etc.

NYCHAPS (Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society)

The Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society (NYCHAPS) has a busy spring and summer planned.

April 9th and 10th NYCHAPS will officially open their two buildings for a new season of tours and events by joining with local merchants in "Hop thru The Shops" to support the Krux Student Center. Dill's Tavern will have special demonstrations as well as offering tours. Regular admissions of \$4 per person twelve years of age and over or \$10 per family apply. The Maple Shade Barn and museum will also be open and those who purchase a Hop Thru the Shops ticket will get 10% off admissions and any purchase in the Maple Shade Gift Shop.



Sunday, April 17th, NYCHAPS will hold its spring tea. The theme will be "Hats Off to Spring" and a \$25 gift certificate to the Maple Shade Gift Shop will be given for the best hat worn that day. Ticket prices will be \$18 with Tavern Keepers receiving a \$2 discount and Founders a \$4 discount. Proceeds will benefit our educational outreach programs.

May 14th, spring is in full bloom as NYCHAPS hosts Publick Tyme at Dill's Tavern and Picklefest at Maple Shade Barn. A time line of re-enactors, authors, craft demonstrators and tours will be at the Tavern and the NYCHAPS kitchen will be serving pork barbeque and pickle soup at the Barn. You'll be able to order pickle soup by the quart ahead of time for a small discount this year.

On the first weekend in June, NYCHAPS will be holding Tavern Days at Dills, a two day total immersion weekend on life in a 18th century Tavern with nationally renown speakers, craftsmen and re-enactors. The registration fee is \$249, which includes overnight lodging in the Tavern and a hearth cooked dinner.

All second to fifth graders should hold open the last week in July for the Dill's Tavern Colonial Camp. Colonial cooking, crafts and games for five historically fun filled days. Details are being worked out and information should be going home in back packs shortly.

August 13th, is WWII Day at Dill's Tavern. The grounds will be filled with re-enactors and demonstrators from that period in the not so distant past. We will be asking everyone who had a loved one in that war, whether a Dillsburgian or not, to share a picture and a brief story about them. The Day will end with this year's performance by the Will Fisher Orchestra on the Tavern courtyard. The daytime activities are free, but there will be a \$15 per ticket charge for the Dance.





DILLSBURG, PA - PickleFest is an annual street fair hosted by Citizens Hose Fire Company #1 and Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society (NYCHAPS). Arts & Crafts, community services and local businesses lining Greenbrier Lane lead to "Publik Tyme," a living history encampment of re-enactors at Dill's Tavern.

Activities include the **5K Pickle Chase**, **1-mile Fun Run**, Children's Safe House, Bounce House, and a quick, messy, and hilarious-to-watch **Pickle-Eating Contest** sponsored by "Dickie's Dills." Kids of all ages can learn how to play Pickle Ball, dip chocolate-covered gherkins, and try Pickle Ice Cream, a novelty flavor made by Bruster's especially for this event. Food service located at **Maple Shade Barn**, features traditional favorites of pulled-pork, burgers hot off the grill, and Dillsburg Senior Center's famous Pickle Soup.

Stage entertainment throughout the day includes a performance by Dillsburg's own homegrown band, "Tuckahoe Ridge," Fire-eating & Magic by Michael Thomas, and visits from "Publik Tyme" re-enactors spanning 18th Century to World War II eras.

Despite the event being held on their Due Date, **Mr. and Mrs. Pickle** will provide photo opportunities with the public. A "**Name the Baby**" contest will be drawn at 1:00pm with winning honors of "Godparent." Emergency responders will monitor Mrs. Pickle's vital signs, in case of "pickling!"

Status of Property Tax/Rent Rebates

A new web tool allows Pennsylvanians to check status of property tax/rent rebates.

Eligible older adults and residents with disabilities can now check the status of Property Tax/Rent Rebate applications on line.

Six weeks after submitting a Property Tax/Rent Rebate application, the applicant may visit www.papropertytaxrelief.com and check the status of the rebate by entering his/her Social Security number, anticipated rebate amount and birth date. Applicants may use the Website to confirm claim status, rebate amount and the date a rebate is expected to be mailed or direct-deposited. Rebate checks are not mailed until after July 1st.

Property Tax/Rent Rebate claim forms (PA1000) and information are available online at www.papropertytaxrelief.com and by calling 1-888-222-9190. Forms and assistance also are available at Department of Revenue district office (listed in the government section of local telephone directories), local Area Agencies on Aging, senior centers and state legislators' offices.

The deadline to apply for a rebate on property taxes or rent paid in 2010 is June 30, 2011.

Friendly and Safety reminders

Sump Pump Discharge—While the Borough recognizes the need for sump pump use, property owners should be considerate of their neighbors. A sump pump discharge pipe directed towards adjacent properties can create problems such as unwanted water for your neighbor. When possible owners should discharge the sump pump to a front or rear yard onto an area that can absorb the water and allow infiltration instead of simply directing the water onto an adjacent property. Sump pump discharges directly to the Borough streets should be avoided. Sump pump discharge directly to Borough streets or sidewalks can create nuisance problems such as algae buildup and slick wet spots in the summer months and icing in the winter months. Constant discharge of water can also reduce the life of the curb and street surface, increasing maintenance costs for the Borough. With proper permitting, sump pumps can be connected directly to the storm sewer system; however it is illegal for a sump pump to discharge to the sanitary sewer system. Property owners should consult the Borough for assistance in determining the proper discharge method for your sump pump.

 **Streetlights** - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket Thomas B. Austin in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.



 **Residents and motorists** are reminded to re-new their awareness of children playing and riding bicycles. Please slow down and be extra careful when driving in residential areas by driving defensively and expecting that from behind every parked car a child may appear.

Please remember that it is the law - Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Offenders can and will be fined.

Got Grass? Mow High! Make your lawn easier and cheaper to maintain by mowing high – **three inches** is the rule! The roots of your lawn grow as deep as the grass grows tall, so taller grass has deeper, healthier roots. Keep your lawn 3” or higher and never cut off more than 1/3 of the blade each time you mow. A healthy lawn tolerates hot, dry weather better – so you won’t need to spend your summer watering and fertilizing.



Dillsburg Community Park

Big Park Plans Begin! Dillsburg Borough Council is pushing full-steam ahead to provide residents with its “first ever” community park. Residents of the Borough can look forward to visiting, playing and swimming at the **Dillsburg Community Park**. The Park will be located on South Chestnut Street, across the street from the Dillsburg Elementary School on 5.5 acres of ground formerly slated for high density residential development. The Borough expects nearly most residents in Dillsburg Borough will be within walking distance of the park.

Park plans include: Large and small dog parks, fitness trail, youth and tot playgrounds, pavilion, on-site restroom facilities, public community swimming pool and parking accommodations. The park will also include a multi-use building that may house the Dillsburg Senior Center, New Hope Pantry, organization offices and a community multi-purpose room.

The park project has been split into several development phases including:

Park Phase	Projects	Timeframe
Phase 1	Land Acquisition and construction of the dog parks and site grading for parking	Year 1
Phase 2	Pool Feasibility Study and construction of youth playground facilities, parking lot, and fitness trail	Year 2
Phase 3	Swimming Pool and Community Center building Design and Specifications	Year 3
Phase 4	Pool and Community Center Construction	Years 4 and 5

Borough Council is developing a funding strategy that includes a park donation campaign and grant funding. Dillsburg Borough is working in partnership with a local bank and has set up a special account for residents, businesses and other interested organizations to take cash donations. All checks should be made out to “Dillsburg Community Park”. In an effort to lower the Borough’s financial obligations, we ask that you consider donating to the park project or perhaps sponsor a venue. All donations are considered a charitable tax deduction.

Trash Pick-up and Recycling


Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings, with the exceptions of May 30, July 4 and September 5, which will be picked up on Thursday due to the holiday falling on or before the normal pick up day.

Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:

1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow way!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.
4. Check out the guidelines below to learn how to recycle successfully.

Residential and Commercial recycling figures are used in preparation of the Act 101-Section 904, Recycling Performance Grant. Dillsburg Borough received \$6,217.00 for the recycling efforts in 2009.

Containers

2. Rinse thoroughly.

- Drinking glass
- Aluminum foil
- Scrap metal
- Tupperware or disposable plastic containers
- Plastic tableware, (knives, forks, spoons, etc)
- Plastic grocery bags
- Light bulbs
- All solvent, oil & chemical containers

Paper, Paperboard & Cardboard

Recycle These Items:


- Cardboard boxes
- Pizza boxes
- Food boxes (i.e. cereal & jello boxes)
- Empty Paper towel & toilet paper rolls
- Paperboard packaging (i.e. tissue boxes)
- Office Paper (any color)
- Shredded paper (in clear plastic bags please)
- Newspaper & inserts
- Magazines, catalogs & brochures
- Junk Mail & envelopes
- Paper bags
- Phone books & other soft cover books

Prepare:

1. Remove all packaging (Styrofoam, peanuts, plastic, bubble wrap, plastic liners, etc).
2. Flatten ALL boxes.
3. Bundle cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin.
4. Cover loose paper with heavier containers to prevent it from blowing away.
5. Check weather forecast: If the forecast calls for high winds or rain, keep your recycling inside until the following week if possible.

UNACCEPTABLE:

- Plastic bags
- Food spoiled material
- Paperboard Juice Containers
- Soaked and/or wet papers or cardboard
- Used paper towels or tissues

County and Borough Real Estate and Per Capita/Occupation Taxes were sent out on February 14, 2011. Please call if you have not received them. It is your responsibility to see that you receive them. School Real Estate and Per Capita Taxes will be mailed out in July 2011. Taxes not paid by December 31, 2011 will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector or turned over to the tax claim of York County. Tax bills can be dropped off and put in through the mail slot in the tax office door when the office is closed.

If your taxes are paid by your mortgage company and you would like a receipt, send a self addressed stamped envelope after April 15, 2011 to Madeline and a receipt will be sent back to you. The State Law states that the tax bills be sent to the homeowners, information is sent to the mortgage companies only if they request it.

The tax office is open several days a week, mostly between 12:00 to 2:00pm. Call for updates or check the insert that was mailed with your tax bills for special hours. The tax office is handicap accessible.



Special Needs Residents

If you would require special assistance from emergency personnel, please call the Borough office for a Confidential Emergency Information form. Only emergency personnel in the Borough will use this confidential information and must be kept updated.

Building Permits-Do I Need One?

Please contact the Borough Office staff **BEFORE** you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property (this includes any type of swimming pool). The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits required. Failure to apply for a permit could result in a fine.

Borough Ordinances

(Listed are a few ordinances that will be enforced and residents should be aware of. A complete listing can be found at the Borough office and/or the Dillsburg Borough website.)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at *Timberview Veterinary Hospital; 106 W. Cabin Hollow Road, Dillsburg - 432-2513*. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.

Curfew: The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11:00 pm and 6:00 am. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.

Requirements to cut & trim grass/weeds: No owner shall at any time permit grass, weeds or other vegetation to grow on their property to a height in excess of 8 inches, so that the said lot shall conform generally in appearance to surrounding areas. Methods other than cutting or trimming may be utilized so long as there is no interference with or damage to adjoining land. Undeveloped lots greater than one acre in size are excluded from this; a twenty-foot-wide buffer area must be provided adjacent to all abutting developed properties and public streets and sidewalks within which no weeds or plant growth in excess of 8 inches shall be permitted.

Requirements to cut & trim trees: A property owner shall be required to cut/trim and keep trimmed all trees, bushes, shrubbery, flowers or other vegetation. A clearance of at least 8 feet above the sidewalk and 14 feet above any street is required.
