Snow Emergency Parking

Miller Brothers Construction and the Borough of Dillsburg have worked together to have a place for residents to park during a snow emergency. MBC will allow residents to park in the **REAR** lot of the Dollar General located on Baltimore Street. All residents who park there must park only in the rear lot. If anyone parks in the front or side lot, in front of Rose Alley, you risk being towed at your expense. All parking during the snow emergency must be to the rear of Rose Alley and be removed as soon as the snow emergency is lifted. We thank you for your cooperation so that this does not interfere with the operation of the businesses at this location and can continue to help our community.

We utilize an automatic call system when time permits for emergencies and important information. If you have never been contacted via this system, please contact us at 432-9969. If you would prefer to receive a text message or e-mail, please forward your cell phone number or e-mail address to us via a phone call or e-mail to dillsburg@dillsburg.com with the subject "Communicate".

The Borough, as well as area non-profit organizations in the area, are always in need of VOLUNTEERS. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact the Borough Office for a list of organizations in need of your help.

If you or anyone you know would need special assistance during an emergency, the Dillsburg Emergency Management Association **must** be made aware of this. Please contact the Borough Office in order to get the necessary form.

Reminders: There is **NO BURNING** allowed in the Borough. **RECYCLING IS MANDATORY** in the Borough. Grass, dirt, snow and/or other debris may **NOT** be placed on Borough streets. **You need to check** with the Borough staff before you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property. The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits needed.

Autumn is once again approaching and the leaves will soon begin falling. Please keep an eye and/or ear out for the leaf pickup dates.

One last thing: If and when the snow comes, remember that you are responsible for where you park your vehicle, removing snow from your sidewalks, keeping fire hydrants cleared and where you put snow. Snow should **NOT** be placed on streets, alleys, sidewalks or neighboring property. Thanks to Miller Brothers, "snow" parking is now available for residents to park their vehicles during snow emergencies.



Most building permits fall under the PA UCC which requires a review of the application and inspections of the construction. The cost of building permits vary with each application. Please call the Borough Office for building permit fees. **FAILURE TO APPLY FOR PERMIT WILL RESULT IN A FINE!!!**

A zoning permit is required for erecting or adding any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools and concrete patios/pads are just a few examples when a zoning permit is required.

A Message from the Tax Collector

County & Borough Per Capita/Occupation & Real Estate taxes are mailed in February. Northern York County School Per Capita & Real Estate taxes are mailed in July. **If you have not received your tax notices, please call me.** Payments made after December 15th must be in cash, cashier check or money order. Unpaid tax notices will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector or the tax claim of York County at the end of the year, incurring added cost.

You may also check to see if your tax payment from your mortgage company was received at my office. Send a stamped self-addressed envelope & a copy of your tax bill & I will send a receipt back to you. The State Law states that real estate tax bills be sent to the homeowners, information is sent to the mortgage companies only if they request it.

If you have any questions, feel free to give me a call. If I'm not available, please leave a brief message and your phone number and I will return your call as soon as possible. There is a drop box on the front of my house for your convenience, which may be used anytime when my office is closed. Check the insert that was mailed with the tax bills for office hours.

Dispose of Your Unwanted Medications Properly



Carroll Township Police Department has a MedReturn medication take back box in the lobby. Please bring all of your old or unused medications to the box so that we may dispose of them for you. This keeps them out of the hands of children and ensures the water supply isn't contaminated if they are flushed down the toilet. **The items that are accepted are:** prescriptions (solid or liquid medications), prescription patches & ointments, inhalers, over the counter medication, vitamins, samples and medications for pets. **Not accepted items:** Thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, personal care products in the form of non-prescription ointments, liquids or lotions, medications from business or clinics, needles (sharp), bloody or infectious waste and hazardous waste. The lobby is open from 8:30 am

to 4:30 pm during business hours.

Dillsburg Lions Club

The Dillsburg Lions Club has been serving the Dillsburg community for 85 years. The 56 men and women who make up the club are committed to community service. Lions Clubs worldwide have a primary mission of assistance with eyesight related issues. Locally, the Dillsburg Lions provide funding for people in need to obtain eye care and glasses. We also collect used eyeglasses for recycling in developing nations where having funds for glasses is not possible. The free eye care and recycled glasses provided by Lions makes it possible for people to obtain work and for children to learn to read. The Dillsburg Lions annually award five \$1,000 scholarships to Northern High School seniors, we sponsor camperships at Beacon Lodge a summer camp for adults and children with vision challenges and other special needs. We provide donations to several community groups and youth groups. Recently we completed refurbishing the pavilion in Logan Park. The Dillsburg Lions constructed the pavilion in 1991. Our work depends on two primary fund raising activities: Farmer's Fair parade bleacher seats; and a southern gospel concert on April 7, 2017. The concert this year will feature performances by Legacy Five and Brothers in Grace. The concert will be held in the Northern High School Auditorium. Reserved seat tickets are \$22.00 and general admission tickets are \$20.00. Stormwater Pollution

Stormwater pollution threatens our rivers, streams, and wetlands. Stormwater picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, manure and other pollutants as it flows over surfaces.

We rely on our rivers and streams for drinking, recreation, and to support wildlife.

Take these simple steps to prevent stormwater pollution:

- Remember, only rain goes down the drain. Do not dump anything down storm drains and keep them clear of debris.
- Wash your car over your lawn or gravel.
- Minimize your use of lawn and garden chemicals.
- Minimize the use of salt-melt.
- Install a rain barrel or cistern to capture roof runoff.
- Clean up trash and yard clippings.

- No weapons (including toy weapons) and No solicitations.

No furniture, ropes, tape or barricades.....

Please be advised that in the past, many of the barricades and chairs, while placed in front of a property owner's residence, were placed within the Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way. Some created safety issues. Borough Council will be taking the proper measures this year to have the Public Works Department **remove any improperly placed furniture, ropes, tape or barricades** which prevent general public access to the sidewalk, curb and street area which is within the Dillsburg Borough or Penn DOT right-of-way which are placed **before streets are closed on Friday, October 14th**. Chairs, blankets, etc **MAY NOT** be placed on the ADA ramps at any time.

Borough Council certainly doesn't wish to discourage those persons living along the parade routes from obtaining the best seating in front of their residence, but obstructions placed solely to prevent others from utilizing the public right-of-way will not be tolerated. As such, we look forward to a better situation during the 2016 Farmers' Fair with the cooperation of Dillsburg Borough residents living along the parade routes.

Leaf & Christmas Tree Collections



The Borough will once again be assisting Residents with their task of disposing of leaves with our leaf vac. The tentative dates are October 24, 2016 through December 1, 2016 (Monday, Tuesday & Thursday).

The Public Works Department will be collecting Christmas trees on Monday, January 9, 2017 & Monday, January 16, 2017. All decorations & tinsel must be removed from the trees & please **do not** place the tree in a Christmas tree trash bag.



Preparing Mailboxes for Winter

The Borough Public Works supervisor reminds residents living along local roads that now is the time to prepare your mailboxes for the winter months. Snow thrown from plows can easily damage mailboxes that are not prepared. Mailboxes are normally placed within the state's legal right-of-way; however, **mailbox damage is the responsibility of the property owner.** If a mailbox is placed as far from the edge of the road (in other words, the mailboxes should not overhang past the curb) and the mailbox should be placed on a sturdy support, it should be able to withstand the force of snow thrown from a plow. The Borough offers these tips to help reduce the risk of mailbox damage.

- Place a 6 to 8 inch piece of reflective tape on the mailbox to help snow plow operators see it at night.
- Remove snow from around the mailbox, but never throw it back onto the road.
 - If the mailbox is located within the right-of-way and damage was experienced in the past, homeowners may want to consider repositioning the mailbox before winter.

Friendly and Safety reminders



Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fee will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.



Special Need Forms

If you or someone you know who lives in Dillsburg Borough has special needs, special needs forms are available. Only emergency personnel in the Borough will use this confidential information. Please call the Borough Office at 432-9969 and request a form be mailed to you or stop by the office during normal business hours and pick one up. Please note: You must fill out a form in advance and keep it updated if you would require special assistance from emergency personnel.

Trash Pick-up and Recycling

Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings.

Christmas Tress will be collected on January 9, 2017 and January 16, 2017



Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:

1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow way!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.
4. Check out the guidelines below to learn how to recycle successfully.



Prepare:

1. Remove all packaging (Styrofoam, peanuts, plastic, bubble wrap, plastic liners, etc).
2. Flatten ALL boxes.
3. Bundle cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin.
4. Cover loose paper with heavier containers to prevent it from blowing away.
5. If the forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, if possible, keep your paper recyclables until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.

UNACCEPTABLE:

Plastic bags

Food spoiled material

Paperboard Juice Containers

Used paper towels or tissues

Soaked and/or wet papers or cardboard

Trash Pick-up and Recycling

One bulk item per week that can be lifted by two men is allowed to be placed out on your regular trash day for pick-up. Appliances containing Freon must be prescheduled by calling Penn Waste at 1-866-575-8720. For safety purposes, doors to appliances must be removed. Pay-per-bay customers must attach a Penn Waste trash bag to the bulk item. **Acceptable Bulk items include:** Furniture, washer/dyer, hot water tank, dish washers, mattresses, carpet (4'length rolled/tied), lawn mowers (must have a dry fuel tank and lids removed), automobile tires off the rim (1 per week). **Unacceptable Bulk items include:** Household hazardous waste, chemicals, propane tanks, yard waste, construction waste and loose piles.

Electronics Recycling

As of January 24, 2013, by law Penn Waste is not allowed to collect your electronic waste.

The Covered Devices Recycling Act prohibits residents and businesses from placing their electronic waste at the curb or in their trash.

Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer & speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the Internet.

The Fairview Township's Electronic Recycling Center, located at 55 Fairview Road, New Cumberland, PA 17070 is now open to all York County residents. For hours of operation or any questions check out their website at <http://twp.fairview.pa.us/>

Borough Ordinances

(Listed are a few ordinances that will be enforced and residents should be aware of. A complete listing can be found at the Borough office and/or the Dillsburg Borough website.)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Snow/Ice Removal: All sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of the precipitation stopping. Failure to clear sidewalks COULD result in fines being issued to the property owners. Snow and Ice may NOT be deposited onto the streets and alleys in the Borough. Remember to be aware of the Snow Emergency routes and move your vehicles from the area if a Snow emergency is called. The streets designated as snow emergency routes within the Borough are as follows: Baltimore Street, York Street, Harrisburg Street, Harrisburg Pike and Chestnut Street. **All streets will be plowed curb to curb, so please remove your vehicles from the streets.**



Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at the York County Treasurer's Office. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.



Curfew: The Borough has a curfew ordinance in effect which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11:00 pm and 6:00 am. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.

Holiday Fire Safety

Each year fires occurring during the holiday season claim the lives of over 400 Americans, injure 1,650 more, and cause over \$990 million in damage.

According to the U. S. Fire Administration (USFA), there are simple life-saving steps you can take to ensure a safe and happy holiday. By following some of the outlined precautionary tips, individuals can greatly reduce their chances of becoming a holiday fire casualty.

Special fire safety precautions need to be taken when keeping a live tree in the house. A burning tree can rapidly fill a room with fire and deadly gases.

Caring for your tree: Do not place your tree close to a heat source, including a fireplace or heat vent. Be careful not to drop or flick cigarette ashes near a tree. Do not put your live tree up too early or leave it up for longer than two weeks. Keep the tree stand filled with water at all times.

Maintain your holiday lights: Inspect your lights. Do not overload electrical outlets. Do not leave holiday lights on unattended.

Holiday Decorations: Use only nonflammable decorations. Never put wrapping paper in the fireplace. Avoid using lit candles. Never put lit candles on a tree.

Finally, as in every season, have working smoke alarms installed on every level of your home, test them monthly and keep them clean and equipped with fresh batteries at all times. Know when and how to call for help. And remember to practice your home escape plan.

Remember Your Pets

As we approach the winter months and the holiday seasons, remember the safety of your pets. Here are some safety and health tips recommended by the AKC.

Safety Tips:

- Please remember to be careful if playing with your pet on a frozen lake or pond. You or your pet could be injured by sharp ice edges or weak surfaces, causing injury.
- Regular grooming to eliminate excess hair from the feet will prevent snow from gathering between the toes. Petroleum jelly may soften the pads and prevent cracking.
- Please provide proper shelter for your pet to get out of the cold, wind, rain and snow.
- Frost bite can occur on the ears, tail and feet if left outdoors too long.

Health Tips:

- Antifreeze is highly poisonous. It may be on the floor of the driveway or garage. Keep opened containers out of pets' reach.
- Rock Salt may irritate the foot pads. Try to use Pet Friendly alternatives to melt ice from the sidewalks.
- Holly, Mistletoe and Poinsettia plants are toxic to pets and should be kept out of reach.
- Turkey bones should not be fed to your dog. They can splinter and can cause choking.

Holiday Tips:

- The holidays are not the time to introduce a new pet into the home.
- Place wires and electrical cords out of reach of chewing and tugging.
- Tinsel is dangerous for dogs. It may obstruct circulation and can block intestines if ingested.
- Alcohol and chocolate are toxic for pets. It is suggested that grapes may also be harmful. Keep the holiday treats for yourself!
