The Borough will once again be assisting Residents with their task of disposing of leaves with our leaf vac. Please keep an eye and/or ear out for the leaf pickup dates. The Public Works Department will be collecting Christmas trees on Monday, January 5th & Monday, January 12th. All decorations and tinsel must be removed from the trees and please do not place the tree in a Christmas tree trash bag.



HELLO! to all Borough Residents & Property Owners

Autumn is once again approaching and the leaves will soon begin falling. Leaf pickup will begin on October 27, 2014. If and when the snow comes, remember that you are responsible for where you park your vehicle, removing snow from your sidewalks, keeping fire hydrants cleared and watch where you put snow. Snow should NOT be placed on the streets, alleys, sidewalks or neighboring property. There will also be a new winter weather ordinance in effect this year which **PROHIBITS PARKING on the even numbered side of a street during a snow or ice event.** You should receive more details about this via mail within the next few weeks. If you do not, please call the office or go to the Borough's website or cable channel for the information.

Organizations in the Borough are always in need of VOLUNTEERS. *The Senior Center is in desperate need of Meals on Wheels delivery people.* If you are interested in volunteering, please contact the Borough Office for a list of organizations in need of your help.

If you or anyone you know would need special assistance during an emergency, the Dillsburg Emergency Management Association *must* be made aware of this. Please contact the Borough Office in order to get the necessary form.

IF YOU DO NOT WANT TO BE FINED, please remember that:

There is **NO BURNING** allowed in the Borough.

RECYCLING IS MANDATORY in the Borough.

Grass, dirt, snow and/or other debris may NOT be placed on the Borough streets.

You need to check with the Borough staff before you begin any additions, repairs or installations of any kind, anywhere on your property. The staff will inform you of the current ordinances and necessary permits needed.

The Borough tries to keep residents informed throughout the year by advertising in the Dillsburg Banner, putting as much information as possible on its cable channel and website and utilizing the new communication system. However, many residents find the newsletter to be the most comprehensive form of communication. Please read this newsletter and save it for future reference. If you would like the newsletter sent to you via e-mail instead of regular mail, please let us know. We also utilize an auto-

matic call system when necessary for emergencies and important information. If you have never been contacted via this system, please contact us at 432-9969.

Don't hesitate to contact me at the Borough Office with any questions or concerns. You are also welcome to stop in at the office any time and I would like to invite all Residents and Property & Business Owners to attend Borough meetings.

If there is other information you would like to see in the newsletter, please let Debbi or I know.



In Pennsylvania, in addition to the state personal income tax collected by the PA Department of Revenue, municipalities, school districts and the county may each levy several different types of taxes. These may include the following:

Real Estate Tax – levied by the county, school district and municipality on real estate owned within their jurisdictions. Each taxing authority will levy a different millage rate, and bills are mailed in the spring for county and municipal tax and in the summer for school district tax. This tax may or may not be paid through your mortgage company. Your municipality has a locally elected real estate tax collector who will collect this tax.

Earned Income Tax – levied by the municipality and school district where you reside. It's a tax on gross wages profits. Tax rates are 1% or higher depending on the school district where you live, and the tax is shared between the municipality and the school district. If you work within Pennsylvania your employer is required to withhold the tax and remit it to the collector where the employer is located. The York Adams Tax Bureau collects the tax for most of York and all of Adams Counties. If you are self-employed or work out-of-state, you are required to make estimated quarterly payments of the tax due. An annual Individual Earned Income Tax Return must be filed with the YATB by April 15th following the end of the tax year. A return must be filed even if you had no earned income. Only permanently retired or disabled individuals are exempt from filing.

Local Services Tax – levied by some municipalities where you work. It is an occupational privilege tax of a maximum of \$52.00 per year, withheld by your employer at no more than \$1.00 per week. YATB is the LST collector for certain municipalities in York and Adams Counties. In other cases, the locally elected tax collector has been appointed to collect the tax. Low income exemptions may apply.

Per Capita Tax - This is an annual head tax of \$5.00 or \$10.00 levied by some municipalities and school districts. It is collected by your locally elected tax collector. YATB collects **delinquent** per capita tax for some Dillsburg Borough.

Other Taxes – In Dillsburg Borough, you also pay an occupational assessment tax.

Information for York County Residents

Greetings! Whether you have recently moved to the area from out-of-state, or if you have resided in Pennsylvania all your life, it is important for you to understand Pennsylvania local taxes that may impact you.

Logan Park

The Logan Park playing fields, walking trail, playground and pavilion continue to be used by many adults and children of the community. A record number of people came out for the "National Night Out" on August 5th, and it was a big success. The Dual Shoot-out Soccer Tournament will be held here at the park on October 11th and 12th.

The application has been sent in to the Penn State Cooperative Extension for the garden (next to the barn) to be certified as a "Pollinator Friendly Garden". Nancy Putt, a PA Certified Horticulturist, has been adding native wild flowers to the existing garden to benefit the butterflies and bees and also as an educational feature of the park.


Anyone wishing to reserve the pavilion for a future event, call Shelyv Morehead 432-4835. The use fee per day is \$65.

Trash Pick-up and Recycling

Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings.



Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:

1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow away!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.

Larger Recycling Containers

Since our residents are becoming more aware of the benefits of recycling and since it is mandatory in the Dillsburg Borough, larger recycling containers are available. Dillsburg Borough, through a grant from DEP, has larger 32 gallon, recycling containers available. Any resident who would like one should stop by the Borough office during normal office hours. If you currently have a smaller green recycling container, you can bring it to the office and exchange it for a larger one.

The Northern York County Historical and Preservation Society (NYCHAPS) is pleased to announce that 2014 has been a busy and successful year for us so far. Dill's Tavern is currently open on Sundays from 2 pm. to 4 pm, so please find some time to visit us if you have not yet gotten a chance! Dill's Tavern will be open on Farmer's Fair with reannactors from Colonial America to the WWII era. Make sure to come down and enjoy all of the history the Tavern and the reeanactors have to offer.

In addition to Farmers Fair we are holding our usual Fall events this year as First Fridays return on October 3 with Across the Pond and their Celtic tunes. On November 7 The Weavers will be performing Early American Folk Music and Christmas Music with Greenwood Muse on December 5. First Friday doors open at 6:30 pm and the event starts at 7. DEMA Updates

The Dillsburg Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) meets on a monthly basis to engage in planning for a wide variety of natural and man-made disasters. Our mission is to provide for the protection of persons and property in disasters affecting Dillsburg Borough.

DEMA works directly with Dillsburg Borough's elected officials and staff in addition to the York County Office of Emergency Management (York OEM) in Prevention, Preparedness, Response and Recovery planning. DEMAs is a member of the Northern York County Unified EMA (NEMA) and participates with the Northern York County School District (NYCSD) Safe School Committee.

DEMA continues to train with York OEM, NEMA and the NYCSD on "radiation response skills". Specifically we practice standing up and operating a monitoring and decontamination station.

Come visit us at the Open Air Market during Farmers Fair located between ACE Hardware and St. Paul's Lutheran Church. DEMAs will be providing Preparedness information and supplies for your family at Booth #33 compliments of Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA).

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) training is being planned for early May 2015. The CERT program is a family oriented preparedness program; it is a great way for citizens to gain valuable preparedness skills that can benefit our community. No special skills or certifications are required, but trainees must be at least 15 years of age.



Weeds and grass may not exceed a height of 8 inches. Yards must not be cluttered or littered with rubble and trash.




There is no burning allowed in the Borough





Pools, sheds and fences require a permit. Pools and sheds must meet the zoning requirements.

House numbers must be visible from the street



Trees and bushes shall not obstruct sidewalks, alleys or streets



Most home repairs require a permit. This includes new roofs, window and door replacement, etc.

Pets must be confined to owner's property and under the reasonable control of the individual.

All sidewalk maintenance is the property owner's responsibility. Keep sidewalks free of snow, leaves, weeds and keep in good repair.

Permits are required for the following: New dwellings, swimming pools, additions, fences, porches, decks, sheds, garages, window and door replacement, re-shingling roofs, and any structural changes.

Failure to obtain a permit will result in a fine!!!!

Important Borough Information (Reminders & Ordinances)

Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and possibly correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fine will be \$25.00. If paid to the Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.

Outdoor Burning – Ordinance 2006-4 notes it is declared to be unlawful for any individual, partnership, corporation or other entity to burn or permit to be burned any substances or maintain or permit to be maintained any fire out-of-doors upon any tract of land or public street, road, highway, sidewalk, park or other public place or ground within the Borough of Dillsburg. Notwithstanding, outdoor fire shall be permitted to cook food for human consumption provided the fire is confined to a fire ring, fireplace, charcoal or gas grill or other similar fireproof container.

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Snow/Ice Removal: All sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of the precipitation stopping. Failure to clear sidewalks COULD result in fines being issued to the property owners. Snow and Ice may NOT be deposited onto the streets and alleys in the Borough. Remember to be aware of the Snow Emergency routes and move your vehicles from the area if a Snow Emergency is called. The streets designated as snow emergency routes within the Borough are as follows: Baltimore Street, York Street, Harrisburg Street, Harrisburg Pike and Chestnut Street.

All streets will be plowed curb to curb, so please remove your vehicles from the streets.

Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at the York County Treasurer's office or online at www.york-county.org/departments/treasurers/dog_licenses.htm. It is unlawful for any person owning or having custody of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.



Curfew: The Borough has a curfew ordinance which regulates the times that young people can lawfully be in or upon the streets of the Borough during evening hours. It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to remain in or upon a public place between 11 pm and 6 am. There are some exceptions. A copy of the ordinance can be obtained at the Borough office.



9-1-1 or Non-Emergency Calls

Residents are reminded to call 911 for emergency situations and to call the York County Department of Emergency Services at 717-854-5571 when they need the police for non-emergency situations. Residents are asked not to call police headquarters and leave voice messages for a new incident. They should call 717-854-5571 to speak with the police officers on duty.



New Hope Ministries

New Hope Ministries is a social service agency which provides assistance to at risk and in crisis individuals and families. New Hope Ministries shows the love and hope by serving our neighbors in times of need and supporting their efforts toward stability. Senior Center News

Winter is coming; we'll help you survive it. Who can forget the winter of 2013-2014? Too cold, too much snow, too often. Blah. Even the most decided optimist was depressed. But, the mood of Dillsburg's senior citizens was probably just a bit more upbeat, at least those who never were part of the membership at Dillsburg's Senior Center. The center is located at 1 North Second Street, on the corner of Harrisburg and Second Streets, one block from the square and is open to any York County resident, 60 years of age and older.

If you're 60 or older, live in the borough, and are reading this newsletter, you're eligible. 




