I hope everyone is looking forward to warmer weather. I know I am. I would like to thank all the residents, property owners and business owners that support and work with the Borough and their neighbors, and all the community and Borough volunteers that serve throughout the year. Your constructive criticism and comments, dedication, help, time and ideas make the Borough a better place to live. The Borough and local community groups are always looking for volunteers and representatives. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact us at the Borough Office.

The Borough does advertise in the Dillsburg Banner and puts as much information as possible on its cable channel and website. For those of you that aren't aware, there is an easier way to keep informed. Just send an e-mail to dillsburg@dillsburg.com with a subject of Sign Me Up. We can then inform you via e-mail about road closures, snow emergencies, leaf pick up, no parking, etc. We can even e-mail the newsletter to you instead of mailing it. If you don't have an email address, please make sure the Borough Office has a valid phone number for you.

Brian and Kevin will be out street sweeping, painting curbs, crosswalks and parking lines, as well as doing some road repairs and weeding the curb line. If you have any questions about the exact dates weed spraying will be done or type of pesticide that will be used, contact me during normal business hours (M-F 8am-4:30pm). Watch for "No Parking" signs that will be put out when necessary because of the work scheduled. In order to avoid a fine and having your vehicle towed, please obey these signs. Please slow down, pay attention and be courteous when you see people working on or near the roadway.

FINALLY, the new Borough building will soon be open for business. It will hold, not only the office, but the Public Works Department, the Ambulance service, DEMA, NEMA and a community room. Please stop in for a visit once it is complete.

Dillsburg Emergency Management Association needs to be aware of the special needs of any resident in order to assist during an emergency. If this pertains to you or someone you know, please contact the Borough Staff for a copy of an Emergency Information form. If you have any questions about how to plan for or what to do in an emergency you can contact DEMA via e-mail at dema@dillsburg.com or call 717-648-5886.

I'd like to thank everyone for their efforts with the mandatory recycling. Last year the Borough earned over \$11,000.00 because of you. If you have questions about recycling, please contact the Borough Office.

******Remember that per Borough Code, it is illegal for any owner or custodian to allow any type of pet, including cats, to run at large or for any person to feed stray animals. It states you must clean up after your dogs. It is also illegal to place grass and weed clippings on streets and alleys in the Borough. Fines may reach as much as \$1,000.00 per day plus costs and the pets may be trapped and taken to a shelter******

Tenant Registration

Any individual, corporation, firm or other entity owning property in the Borough of Dillsburg shall notify the Borough Council of any adult over the age of 18 years residing in or on such property who is not a record owner of such property, on forms to be provided by the Borough. Such notification shall be delivered or mailed to the Borough Secretary at the Borough Office.

- A. Whenever any person residing in or on premises owned by any individual, corporation, firm or other entity attains the age of 18 years, such property owner shall notify the Borough within 30 days following such person's 18th birthday.
- B. Whenever any tenant or other person residing in or on premises owned by any person, firm or corporation removes and is replaced by another tenant, whether or not such tenant is in fact paying rent, the person, firm or corporation owning such property shall be obliged to notify the Borough Council of the new tenant within 30 days after such person has moved to said premises in the manner prescribed above.
- C. Any person, firm, corporation or other entity who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues or each Section of this Part which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.

Rent-A-Kid Needs Kids!

The Rent-A-Kid program, sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging, needs kids in middle and senior high school. Rent-A-Kid is an intergenerational program that offers students an opportunity to earn money and/or community service hours doing routine household chores, yard work, mowing lawns, technology assistance, pet care, or shoveling snow for York County seniors. The program also provides an opportunity for older adults and teenagers to interact and help each other.

Kids who wish to register must be in grades 7 through 12. Applications are available at all school guidance offices or they can be downloaded from the 'Forms & Documents' page of www.ycaaa.org.

The rate of pay is to be negotiated between the teenager and the older adult at the time of hiring.

- Last day to REGISTER for the Primary Election is Monday, May 2, 2022.
- Mail in Ballots are available to qualified voters. The last day to APPLY for the mail-in or Civilian Absentee Ballot is Tuesday, May 10, 2022.
- If a voter is unsure that the ballot will be received on time, the voter may return the ballot directly to the County Board of Elections office on Election Night, May 17th by 8:00pm.
- If a voter is still unsure and can't deliver the ballot the voter may go to her/his polling place and cast a provisional ballot.
- Last day for a voted military and overseas absentee ballots to be received at county office is Tuesday, May 24, 2022.

Tax Collector, Debbi Beitzel, would like to remind residents that Real Estate bills for County, Borough and Borough Per Capita/Occupation tax bills were mailed on February 15th.

If your taxes are in escrow, that bill should be forwarded to your mortgage company for payment. Mortgage companies do not pay per capita bills!

All residents 18 years of age and older, regardless of job status, should be receiving a per capita tax bill. Please notify the tax collector if someone at your residence should be added to the tax rolls. **It's your responsibility to contact me if you haven't received your taxes and also if your job status has changed!!**

Special hours will be detailed in mailed tax bills. A mailbox is available at my residence to drop off payments when the office is not open.

Unpaid tax bills will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector and/or the Tax Claim Office of York County at the end of the year, incurring added cost.

Spring is here at the Dillsburg Area Public Library! We've got a lot going on over on Mumper Lane!



Our Spring Friends Booksale will take place beginning on April 23 from 9am to 5pm and continuing from April 25 to 30 during regular library hours. On April 30 you can fill a bag for \$5. We are currently collecting items for the sale and will do so until April 18. There will be bargains for every taste! We cannot accept VHS or cassette tapes, Reader's Digest condensed books, encyclopedias, old textbooks, or any material that is moldy, musty or otherwise not saleable.

There are plenty of other activities to keep you informed and educated. Pre-school Story Time takes place on Tuesdays and Baby and Toddler Story Time occurs on Thursdays, both at 10:30am. These programs will end for the spring on May 12 and do not require registration.

Other popular children's programs include Lego Club on the first Thursday of each month and Coding Club on the third Thursday of each month. Both programs include an in-person and a remote option, with the in-person beginning at 6pm.

News from Logan Park—Your Community Park

Logan Park has been anything but quiet during the last few months.

Spring clean-up at the park will take place on April 23rd at 9:00 a.m. All are invited to pitch in and bring your work gloves, rakes, and leaf blowers. If anyone has questions, please call Nancy Putt at 717-712-3951.

The biggest project undertaken at the park in 2021 was the creation of a riparian buffer along the lower part of the park as a result of an agreement with the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay. A path along the buffer was also staked out by a member of DCNR. Over the Columbus Day weekend, 315 trees of 20 varieties were planted with the assistance of park neighbor volunteers. A special thanks and appreciation to Pete Ramsey from Range End who brought a zero-turn mower for the area.

Security cameras have been installed in various locations in the park to deter vandalism and trespassing at night.

The interior of the barn is also undergoing renovations. The barn utility room was updated to accommodate the camera monitors and a new staircase is in the process of being installed for better accessibility.

Other noted improvements to the park were the installation of two slides and sheds in the park were also spruced up with new paint and roofs.

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Recycling Containers

Since our residents are becoming more aware of the benefits of recycling and because it's mandatory in Dillsburg Borough, larger recycling containers are available. Dillsburg Borough, has larger recycling containers and any resident that would like one should stop by the Borough office during normal office hours. If you currently have a recycling container, that might be damaged and unrepairable, you can bring it to the office and exchange it for a new one.



Trash Pick-up and Recycling

Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings, with the exceptions of **June 1st and July 6 and September 7th**, which will be picked up on Thursday due to the holiday falling on or before the normal pick up day. Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:

1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow way!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.

Making changes to your home? STOP, you might need a permit!

A building permit is needed for new construction, additions, alterations, renovations and repairs. Installing new/replacement windows and doors, re-shingling roofs, re-finishing basements, pre-built sheds, in ground and above ground swimming pools (inflatable pools included), concrete pads and retaining walls also need a building permit. Most building permits fall under the PA uniform Construction Code (UCC) which requires a review of the application and inspections of the construction. The cost of a building permit varies with each application. Please call the Borough office for building permit fees.

A zoning permit is required when erecting or adding any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools, and concrete patios/pads are examples when a zoning permit is needed. The cost of a zoning permit is \$25.00.

Failure to apply for a permit could result in a fine.

Special Need Forms

Please call the Dillsburg Borough Office at (717) 432-9969 and request a form to be mailed to you or stop by the office during normal business hours and pick one up. Please note: You must fill out a form in advance and keep it updated if you would require special assistance from emergency personnel.

EMA UPDATES

Pennsylvania State Law Title 35 requires all municipalities to engage in "all hazard" disaster planning. Dillsburg, along with five other local municipalities, work as a team to plan for natural and man-made disasters; our team is called the Northern York County Unified EMA (NEMA).

Everyone on our staff is a volunteer- we care about our community and donate our time and our skills to help our community be better prepared. Our mission is to provide for the protection of persons and property in disasters affecting the Northern York County community at large. In simple terms, EMA works for our municipal governments through our planning activities- we are not First Responders although we support our Firefighters, Police and Medical personnel.

What does our local Emergency Management Agency do?

*Maintain an emergency operation center (EOC)- our "office" where we communicate with our local municipalities and York County OEM.

*Maintain a staff per the ICS (Incident Command System) organization chart which is a major component of NIMS (National Incident Management System) - each person has a specific job.

*Maintain an emergency operation plan (EOP) including a notification and resource manual (NARM)

Our primary planning functions include:

*Prevention, Preparedness, Response and Recovery activities to meet "all hazard" situations.

Prevention activities include public education on skills such as basic first aid and sheltering in place. These skills will reduce the stress on our first responders and on ourselves in disasters.

Updates:

**We are planning another public education opportunity for June 2022. The "workshop" will be similar to the First Aid Workshop held on November 14, 2021 which was attended by 24 local residents. The format will be another "hands-on" workshop where attendees will learn skills in small groups at various stations. More information will be forthcoming.

**NEMA completed the purchase of new IT equipment at the end of 2021 for our EOC. Dillsburg Borough staff facilitated the purchase from Dell. NEMA qualified for partial reimbursement from York County through the Act 147 (TMI preparedness) funds.

Severe Weather Hazards:

Most of our regional disasters are weather related. Thousands of residents lost power in late February after heavy rain was followed by high winds. SPRING brings the threat of severe thunder storms, high winds and tornadoes. Preparedness means being able to function on your own until the situation is stabilized. Shelter in Place or Evacuate?

Man-made Hazards:

The war in Europe underscores the need for individual preparedness. Thousands of refugees had to leave on short notice as the communist Russian government unleashed their arsenal against homes, schools, hospitals and power plants. Shelter in Place or Evacuate?

Now that we're coming out from under the cloud of Covid, please enjoy time with family, friends and neighbors....and please consider spending some of your time on preparedness.

Friendly & Safety reminders

Sump Pump Discharge—While the Borough recognizes the need for sump pump use, property owners should be considerate of their neighbors. A sump pump discharge pipe directed towards adjacent properties can create problems such as unwanted water for your neighbor. When possible owners should discharge the sump pump to a front or rear yard onto an area that can absorb the water and allow infiltration instead of simply directing the water onto an adjacent property. Sump pump discharges directly to the Borough streets should be avoided. Sump pump discharge directly to Borough streets or sidewalks can create nuisance problems such as algae buildup and slick wet spots in the summer months. Constant discharge of water can also reduce the life of the curb and street surface, increasing maintenance costs for the Borough. With proper permitting, sump pumps can be connected directly to the storm sewer system; however it is illegal for a sump pump to discharge to the sanitary sewer system. Property owners should consult the Borough for assistance in determining the proper discharge method for your sump pump.

Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines - If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fine will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.

Residents and motorists are reminded to re-new their awareness of children playing and riding bicycles. Please slow down and be extra careful when driving in residential areas by driving defensively and expecting that from behind every parked car a child may appear. Please remember that it is the law - Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Offenders can and will be fined.



Ordinances (A complete listing can be found on our website)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and befouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at the York County Treasurer's office or by checking out their website. It is unlawful for any person owning or custodian of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.

Requirements to cut & trim grass/weeds: No owner shall at any time permit grass, weeds or other vegetation to grow on their property to a height in excess of 8 inches, so that the said lot shall conform generally in appearance to surrounding areas. Methods other than cutting or trimming may be utilized so long as there is no interference with or damage to adjoining land. Undeveloped lots greater than one acre in size are excluded from this; a twenty-foot-wide buffer area must be provided adjacent to all abutting developed properties and public streets and sidewalks within which no weeds or plant growth in excess of 8 inches shall be permitted. A property owner shall not deposit grass onto a public street or alley, without removing the same by sunset the date of occurrence and returning the street or alley to its original condition.

Requirements to cut & trim trees: A property owner shall be required to cut/trim and keep trimmed all trees, bushes, shrubbery, flowers or other vegetation. A clearance of at least 8 feet above the sidewalk and 14 feet above any street is required.
