Tuesday May 16, 2023 is the Primary Election in PA! Residents will head to the polls to vote for several races including: 1 PA Supreme Court Judge, 2 Pa Superior Court Judges, 1 PA Commonwealth Judge, 1 York County Court of Common Pleas Judge, York County Commissioners, and York County Row Officers—Clerk of Courts, Prothonotary, Register of Wills, Sheriff, and Treasurer. Magisterial District Judge, Borough Council and School Board elections are also on the ballot in May.

The Location of the Primary Election will be at New Hope Ministries—99 W Church Street, Dillsburg, from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm

Some details include:

- Last day to REGISTER for the Primary Election is Monday, May 1, 2023.
- Mail in Ballots are available to qualified voters. The last day to APPLY for the mail-in or Civilian Absentee Ballot is Tuesday, May 9, 2023.
- If a voter is unsure that the ballot will be received on time, the voter may return the ballot directly to the County Board of Elections office on Election Night, May 16th by 8:00pm.
- If a voter is still unsure and can't deliver the ballot the voter may go to her/his polling place and cast a provisional ballot.
- Last day for a voted military and overseas absentee ballots to be received at county office is Tuesday, May 23, 2023.

Tenant Registration

Any individual, corporation, firm or other entity owning property in the Borough of Dillsburg shall notify the Borough Council of any adult over the age of 18 years residing in or on such property who is not a record owner of such property, on forms to be provided by the Borough. Such notification shall be delivered or mailed to the Borough Secretary at the Borough Office.

- A. Whenever any person residing in or on premises owned by any individual, corporation, firm or other entity attains the age of 18 years, such property owner shall notify the Borough within 30 days following such person's 18th birthday.
- B. Whenever any tenant or other person residing in or on premises owned by any person, firm or corporation removes and is replaced by another tenant, whether or not such tenant is in fact paying rent, the person, firm or corporation owning such property shall be obliged to notify the Borough Council of the new tenant within 30 days after such person has moved to said premises in the manner prescribed above.
- C. Any person, firm, corporation or other entity who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues or each Section of this Part which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.

Special Need Forms

If you or someone you know who lives in the Dillsburg Borough has special needs, special needs forms are available. Only emergency personnel in the Borough will use this confidential information. Please call the Dillsburg Borough Office at (717) 432-9969 and request a form to be mailed to you or stop by the office during normal business hours and pick one up. Please note: You must fill out a form in advance and keep it updated if you would require special assistance from emergency personnel.

Tax Collector

Tax Collector, Debbi Beitzel, would like to remind residents that Real Estate bills for County, Borough and Borough Per Capita/Occupation tax bills were mailed on February 15th.

If your taxes are in escrow, that bill should be forwarded to your mortgage company for payment. Mortgage companies do not pay per capita bills!

All residents 18 years of age and older, regardless of job status, should be receiving a per capita tax bill. Please notify the tax collector if someone at your residence should be added to the tax rolls. **It's your responsibility to contact me if you haven't received your taxes and also if your job status has changed!!.**

Special hours will be detailed in mailed tax bills. A mailbox is available at my residence to drop off payments when the office is not open.

Please include both copies of your bill along with a self-addressed stamped envelope if you would like a receipt.

There is a lot going on this spring and summer at the Dillsburg Area Public Library!

We kick off our spring schedule with the annual Friends of the Library Spring Booksale on April 22 from 9am to 5pm. The sale continues from April 24 to 29 during regular library hours. The final day features the always popular “fill a bag” for \$5.

The library will also take part in the annual Give Local York 24 hour giving event on May 5. On that day, your donations to the library, as well as hundreds of other York County non-profits, will be stretched via a special money pool. Our annual summer lawn concert series will return for a third season in 2023. Concerts will take place in the Library’s Jordan Richardson Reading Garden on June 10 (Across the Pond), July 15 (Tim Colgan), August 12 (TBD), and September 9 (Jim Cooney) – all from 6pm to 8pm.

News from Logan Park—Your Community Park

Spring is around the corner and Logan Park is looking forward to an exciting and busy season.

To celebrate Earth Day, Spring cleanup at the park has been scheduled for April 22, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. All are invited to pitch in and bring your work gloves, shovels, rakes, and leaf blowers. If anyone has questions, please call Nancy Putt at 717-712-3951. Group organizations are all welcome.

Logan Park continues its work to create a riparian forest buffer in the lower area of the park. Due to the drought last summer, it will be necessary to replant approximately 30% of the saplings. The saplings are being provided through an agreement with the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay.

In addition to the park’s work for the riparian buffer, Monarch Watch will be providing 30 milkweed plants to the park for planting. Growing milkweed is the most effective way to help sustain the monarch butterfly.

The interior of the barn was also renovated in 2022. The new improvements have created a multi-purpose space in addition to more room for storage.

Street Sweeping

The Borough will be sweeping the streets again this spring. If you have any questions about exact dates when this will be done, contact the Borough Office during normal business hours. Please watch for “No Parking” signs that will be put out when necessary. In order to avoid a fine and having your vehicle towed, please obey the signs.

Weed Spraying

Brian, Public Works Supervisor, has the necessary certification to spray in Right-of-Ways and will be doing so over the next months, as needed. If you have any questions about exact dates when this will be done or type of pesticide that will be used, contact the Borough Office during normal business hours. Please watch for “No Parking” signs that will be put out when necessary. In order to avoid a fine and having your vehicle towed, please obey the signs.



Recycling Containers

Since our residents are becoming more aware of the benefits of recycling and because it's mandatory in Dillsburg Borough, larger recycling containers are available. Dillsburg Borough, has larger recycling containers and any resident that would like one should stop by the Borough office during normal office hours. If you currently have a recycling container, that might be damaged and unrepairable, you can bring it to the office and exchange it for a new one.

Trash Pick-up and Recycling

Penn Waste's regularly scheduled trash/recycling pick-up days are Wednesday mornings, with the exceptions of **June 1st and July 6 and September 7th**, which will be picked up on Thursday due to the holiday falling on or before the normal pick up day. Dillsburg Residents are reminded it is mandatory to recycle. Here's how you can help:



1. Place your recycling bin out for collection on your scheduled pick up day.
2. When placing paper products in recycling bin with other recyclables, be sure paper is covered by heavier material so it doesn't blow away!
3. Bundle any large loose pieces of cardboard that will not fit in your recycling bin.

Making changes to your home? STOP, you might need a permit!

A building permit is needed for new construction, additions, alterations, renovations and repairs. Installing new/replacement windows and doors, re-shingling roofs, re-finishing basements, pre-built sheds, in ground and above ground swimming pools (inflatable pools included), concrete pads and retaining walls also need a building permit. Most building permits fall under the PA uniform Construction Code (UCC) which requires a review of the application and inspections of the construction. The cost of a building permit varies with each application. Please call the Borough office for building permit fees.

A zoning permit is required when erecting or adding any structure. New construction, additions, garages, sheds, swimming pools, and concrete patios/pads are examples when a zoning permit is needed. The cost of a zoning permit is \$25.00.

Failure to apply for a permit could result in a fine.

MS4—Stormwater

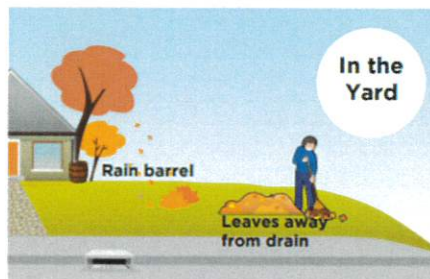
If you've been thinking about reducing your environmental footprint, you can take steps to decrease the amount of pollution that flows from your home into local waterways every time it rains. Known as stormwater, once rain or snow hits the ground, it can carry dirt, chemicals, and other pollutants downstream from your home and yard to the rivers and lakes in your community. Here are a just a few steps you can take to be stormwater smart at home:



Rain is great for your lawn, but excess rain can run off from your yard and walkways into the street, where it flows from the storm drain into local rivers, lakes, or streams, taking any chemical you've applied with it.

- Apply fertilizers and pesticides carefully on your lawn or garden and not on pavement.
- Avoid using fertilizers and pesticides completely if rain is in the forecast.
- Consider installing a rain garden, which is a depressed area planted with grasses or perennials that collects stormwater.

- Wash your car with biodegradable soap to avoid chemicals floating downstream, or visit a carwash.
- Direct water from downspouts and car washing to grassy areas, so it can soak into the ground rather than hit the pavement.
- Don't hose down your driveway and flush dirt down the storm drain.
- When watering your lawn, direct the spray toward your lawn and plants, not the pavement.
- Look for spots on the ground that indicate your car leaks oil or fluid. Don't let your leaks pollute!



- Use permeable pavers instead of hard stones or pavement in your yard to help water absorb into the ground.
- Don't rake leaves or yard clippings into the storm drain to avoid clogs and debris that could cause flooding.
- Install a rain barrel to help prevent rain from flowing into storm drains (and also save water for dry spells!).

- Pick up pet waste and keep trash and dirty water away from pavement and storm drains, where it can contaminate stormwater that flows downstream.
- During colder weather, avoid oversalting your sidewalks and use an appropriate amount of deicer—a little goes a long way.
- Sweep sidewalks and put the debris in the trash.

Friendly & Safety reminders

Sump Pump Discharge—While the Borough recognizes the need for sump pump use, property owners should be considerate of their neighbors. A sump pump discharge pipe directed towards adjacent properties can create problems such as unwanted water for your neighbor. When possible owners should discharge the sump pump to a front or rear yard onto an area that can absorb the water and allow infiltration instead of simply directing the water onto an adjacent property. Sump pump discharges directly to the Borough streets should be avoided. Sump pump discharge directly to Borough streets or sidewalks can create nuisance problems such as algae buildup and slick wet spots in the summer months. Constant discharge of water can also reduce the life of the curb and street surface, increasing maintenance costs for the Borough. With proper permitting, sump pumps can be connected directly to the storm sewer system; however it is illegal for a sump pump to discharge to the sanitary sewer system. Property owners should consult the Borough for assistance in determining the proper discharge method for your sump pump.

Streetlights - Please call the Borough Office if you know of a streetlight that is not working properly. You must know the exact location of the light or pole number in question and the nature of the problem. The Borough office staff will then contact Met-Ed. Met-Ed will then add the situation to their work order list and will be out to verify, and correct, the problem as their schedule allows.

Parking Fines – If you receive a parking ticket in the Borough, the fine will be \$25.00. If paid to the Dillsburg Borough within 72 hours the fine is reduced to \$15.00. If not paid within that time frame it will be turned over to the District Justice.

Residents and motorists are reminded to re-new their awareness of children playing and riding bicycles. Please slow down and be extra careful when driving in residential areas by driving defensively and expecting that from behind every parked car a child may appear. Please remember that it is the law - Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Offenders can and will be fined.



Ordinances (A complete listing can be found on our website)

Property Nuisances: Dillsburg Borough has both property and zoning ordinances that involve property nuisances. Grass, weeds, trees, bushes and other vegetation should be cut or trimmed to prevent overhanging, unsafe conditions and unsightly and/or obnoxious areas. There should not be an accumulation of trash, rubbish, building materials, junk, etc. on your property that could be considered a fire hazard and/ or harborage for snakes, rodents or other vermin. All vehicles, whether on the street or on your property, must be registered, licensed and inspected.

Animals: Ordinance 1988-3 relates to the custody and keeping of animals within the Borough. This Ordinance pertains to the number and type of animals allowed in the Borough, as well as issues dealing with noise, animals running at large and defouling property. An application for a permit is required in order to keep more than 4 dogs & cats, in aggregate number, more than 6 months of age on any premises, regardless of the number of owners. Please be courteous to your neighbors. Take noisy pets indoors. All dogs and cats must be under the control of their owner at all times. All dogs must be licensed yearly. You can get a license at the York County Treasurer's office or by checking out their website. It is unlawful for any person owning or custodian of an animal to permit that animal to defecate upon any public or private property, other than that of the owner or custodian. If an animal does defecate on public or private property, the owner or custodian must dispose of any feces in a non-leaking container for deposit in a trash container.

Requirements to cut & trim grass/weeds: No owner shall at any time permit grass, weeds or other vegetation to grow on their property to a height in excess of 8 inches, so that the said lot shall conform generally in appearance to surrounding areas. Methods other than cutting or trimming may be utilized so long as there is no interference with or damage to adjoining land. Undeveloped lots greater than one acre in size are excluded from this; a twenty-foot-wide buffer area must be provided adjacent to all abutting developed properties and public streets and sidewalks within which no weeds or plant growth in excess of 8 inches shall be permitted. A property owner shall not deposit grass onto a public street or alley, without removing the same by sunset the date of occurrence and returning the street or alley to its original condition.

Requirements to cut & trim trees: A property owner shall be required to cut/trim and keep trimmed all trees, bushes, shrubbery, flowers or other vegetation. A clearance of at least 8 feet above the sidewalk and 14 feet above any street is required.

Emergency Management Agency Updates

All municipalities in Pennsylvania must plan for disasters as per Pennsylvania State Law Title 35 (Health and Safety) which requires municipalities to have a place, a staff and a plan dedicated to disaster preparedness. Our unified group consisting of Dillsburg, Carroll Twp, Franklinton, Monaghan Twp, Warrington Twp, & Wellsville is called NEMA (Northern York County Unified EMA) and our mission is to provide for the protection of persons & property in disasters affecting the Northern York County community at large.

Internal improvements to the EOC (Emergency Operations Center):

*NEMA is engaged in a comprehensive evaluation of our IT capabilities with the help of a student intern from a local university and an educator who is part of our NEMA staff. Our goals for NEMA include (1) creating an SOP (Standard Operating Procedures) Manual for our staff when opening the EOC and using our equipment, (2) learning how to better communicate with York County Office of Emergency Management and (3) creating a Website for NEMA. NEMA's website is being designed for our citizens to use as a preparedness resource; we hope to have it completed by mid May 2023. We will announce it's availability through our Municipalities.

Helping our Seniors become better prepared:

Most of our disasters in Pennsylvania are weather- related and our Senior citizens are an especially vulnerable part of our population. Power outages and mechanical failures of heating/cooling equipment can leave our Seniors in extremely cold or hot homes. There are never enough Police or Firefighters to help in emergencies and disasters; so, we must learn to help ourselves. A Plan is necessary if our Seniors need to leave their home for a short time to stay warm or cool depending on the season. The Plan must involve Family, Friends or Neighbors. Start your planning by:

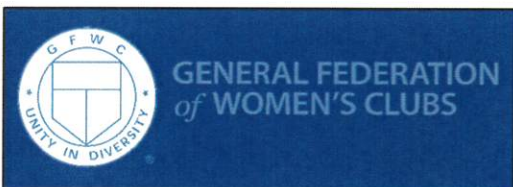
- a. Communicating with each other now.
- b. Determine where you will go with the assistance of Family/Friends/Neighbors.
- c. Determine how you will get there.
- d. Share your contact info and the address of the destination you agreed on with Family/Friends/Neighbors.
- e. Take only essential items- medicine, change of clothes, snack, water, mobile phone and charging device
